## Message from the Minister

Dear friends,

At this time of year many conversations within families involve a common question: "What would you like for Christmas?"

I am reliably informed that I am a difficult person to buy presents for. My two stock answers are not in the least helpful. I either say that I don't need anything, or I suggest a sportscar would be nice. To be honest, neither of these suggestions helps my family. The first answer is true, but unhelpful. The second answer is in fun, and impossible.

If we think in terms of the world, there are needs. There is the need for peace. The harm that conflict and violence causes has certainly marked this year. We have seen the pictures from Ukraine. The suffering of places like Somalia is made worse by conflict. There is the need for justice. The great divide between rich and poor, within nations and between nations, causes great harm. There is the need to care for creation.

We have seen the effects of climate change in the extremes of weather this year.

We sometimes find people challenging our faith in God by asking why God doesn't do something to sort out humanity. Implicit within this is the idea that God simply observes. The answer is that God has done and is doing something.

Christmas is not a children's story. Christmas is not a mid-winter party. Christmas is not about tinsel and glitter. Certainly not about the rampant consumerism of the last few decades. Jesus is born into this world to bring God's love to us, to change hearts and minds, to be our salvation. Christmas is God's gift. Christmas is the answer to human need. Here is the offer of peace, justice and loving care... if we are ready to receive the gift that is

Jesus.

I wish you all of God's blessings through Advent and on into a new year.

#### Inside the Church

The project to refurbish the interior of the church was completed last Christmas, just in time to allow Christmas services to be held. This year we have improved our sound system and we have installed solar panels and batteries allowing the Air Source Heat Pumps to run with a minimum of electricity from the grid. This is another important step in our goal to reduce the carbon footprint of our buildings.



The church is being used by several community groups for their meetings including The Queen Anne Singers choir, the community council and a popular Yoga class. The annual primary school discos were held in the church and proved very popular and successful.

At the moment the building is still available for hire most mornings and afternoons and some evenings for group meetings, group activities or private parties/celebrations.
